THE YOUTH FAIR ANNOUNCES THOUSANDS OF EXCITING EXHIBITS Including NEW interactive displays, crafts, performing arts, agricultural events, cattle shows & more

MIAMI, FL – March 4, 2014 – Now in its 63rd year, The Miami-Dade County Youth Fair & Exposition's longstanding tradition of impressive exhibits continues. This year at The Youth Fair fairgoers can enjoy more than 45,000 exhibits. The Youth Fair believes in showcasing youth achievement through arts, crafts, hobbies, and technical education. Promoting south Florida agriculture is also very important to The Youth Fair.

New Exhibits in 2014:

- **Cowtown-** Taking place in the Agricultural Tent all 18-days of The Youth Fair, *Cowtown* will offer kids the opportunity to enjoy a live cow and goat exhibit, as well as learn from a professional farmer how to differentiate between cow and goat milk, make ice cream, cheese, butter and soap. At *Cowtown*, kids will also get to see a live Texas Longhorn, a gentle breed of cattle known for its massive horns. Plus, kids can take part in a "discovery zone," where they can touch real horns, hides, and bones.
- *Tiny Tots Craft Corner* Located inside Arnold Hall, this new display will highlight the creative work of students in Pre-K to 2nd grade. Students can let their imagination soar by creating artwork in any of the six classes: 2D Crafts, Decorations, Fabric Art, Popsicles, Posters, and Renew, Reuse, and Recycle.
- On the Moo-ve, The Journey of Dairy from Farm to Table- Also located inside Arnold Hall, this new interactive display will showcase the dairy industry and will explain the process of how dairy cows produce milk and what it takes to get milk from the farm to the table.

March 18 & 19 - Howdy Program Tour 9:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m.

Three hundred 3rd grade youngsters will spend the morning learning with Howdy, the wonderful, frecklefaced goodwill ambassador for agriculture at The Fair. With the assistance of students from the Miami-Dade County agriculture programs and the cooperation of our agri-community, he has developed an educational program that helps the local community gain a better appreciation and understanding of those who produce, distribute, and inform us of basic needs: food and the environment. Each year, he provides an introduction to agriculture for third graders who take field trips to The Fair. They are guided by Ag Ambassadors (Miami-Dade County high school students) and learn about the wonderful world of plants and animals. Youngsters receive a first gentle glimpse of hamburger or pork chops on the hoof and learn where milk comes from. At The Fair, the World of Agriculture houses horticulture projects, cows, hogs, lambs, sheep, poultry and rabbits that students have entered for exhibition and are judged for awards.

The Youth Fair is located on Coral Way (SW 24th St.) at 112th Ave. Gates open on weekdays at 3 p.m., Saturdays and Sundays at 12 noon, and at 12 noon during Spring Break, March 21–30, 2014. General admission is \$12 and FREE admission every day, all day for children 5 years and younger, as well as adults 65 and better. Admission for active duty and retired military personnel is \$6, Mon.–Thurs. with Military ID. Offer valid for active and retired military personnel and up to three guests. Guests must present coupon available only at www.fairexpo.com. **Parking is FREE,** every day, all day! Preferred parking is available for \$12 per vehicle and is limited. The P*O*P Unlimited Ride Card is \$25 Mon.-Fri., and P*O*P Weekend Unlimited Ride Card is \$35.
